
The past months have been a mixture of encouragements and some major challenges so we thank you all for your prayers, support and encouragement...




demonstration as part of the weekly Continuing Professional Development programme in Kisiizi.

They are running a 2 year data collection here and will install a special oxygen concentrator with a reservoir system that will provide piped oxygen in Children's Ward, Labour Ward, Maternity Theatre and the Special Care Baby Unit. The system is designed to continue functioning even if there is a power cut.

WRBLO first heard about Kisiizi from the article published in the Economist magazine last year focussing on our Community Health Insurance Scheme. WRBLO are planning to help this scheme and a range of areas in the hospital so we are very grateful for this link which we hope will be complimentary to our existing

partnerships. We believe this support will help us move more quickly towards the target of the Board of Governors that Kisiizi is a place of excellence without compromising access to the poor in our communities. More details in the next newsletter as the project is due to start at the end of April.

Insurance Scheme and only 10,000 UGX (about £2) per month for others! Ladies may be resident in the home for just a few days or for some months in the most vulnerable cases. Universal Health Coverage in action!
