Warm greetings once again from Church of Uganda Kisiizi Hospital...

This is the main drive down to the in-patient area of Kisiizi with the original flax factory building seen in the distance.

Many people walk up and down the path – patients, staff, attendants,



visitors all involved in different aspects of Kisiizi's ministries. Amazingly since Kisiizi opened in 1958 it has never closed its doors to patients. <<< Recently we have welcomed Dr Patrick Saasita, specialist Physician with a special interest in respiratory medicine. He is originally from Democratic Republic of Congo but came to Uganda to do his specialty training in Mbarara. He is pictured with a stick as he visited Kisiizi Falls!

Many of our patients belong to our Community Health Insurance Scheme that is the oldest in Uganda having started in 1996. It has grown steadily year on year since then until the pandemic impact has led to some reduction, but we still have over 40,000 beneficiaries in 6 districts up to 50km away.

This is a not-for-profit scheme and is run by an Executive Committee elected by leaders of the 210 community groups that works with the hospital Management Committee.

The Executive Committee of the **Kisiizi Community Health Insurance Scheme** met with members of the Hospital Management Committee to plan and co-ordinate the important work of this programme. Our research has demonstrated that in addition to providing protection against the risk of catastrophic health expenditure in the event of serious acute illness, our Scheme also has very significant health benefits for enrolled families.



The **Board of Governors** of the hospital met in November 2021 chaired by Bishop Patrick Tugume, the caretaker bishop following the tragic death of Bishop Benon Magezi earlier in 2021. Some readers will recognise Dr Gabbie Okumu (second from left in the back row) who was previously a specialist general surgeon in Kisiizi and is now a Board member. The Board also includes a representative from Uganda Protestant Medical Bureau (UPMB) which is the umbrella organisation that represents us and other similar hospitals and health units to Ministry of Health in Kampala. Our District Health Officer from Rukungiri is also a member of the Board ensuring liaison with government.





Thanks to everyone who tuned in to the virtual *Friends of Kisiizi Day* in November and special thanks to Dr Richard Mayers and Dr Philip Haynes for co-ordinating and compering the event attended by friends of Kisiizi in many different parts of Uganda and the world.

Naturally one key area was the impact of the global pandemic on Kisiizi and its surrounding communities. We are very grateful that our staff have now received two doses of vaccine. The new variant seems to produce a milder disease pattern here so we have

had less serious cases.
The secondary impact
on supply lines, the
ability to refill oxygen
cylinders, and the
economic pressures on
both hospital and
families in the region
continue to challenge us
but the lockdown rules
are now easing with
schools opening again
and public transport
normalising and curfews
lifted.

Students have placements in many different areas of Kisiizi including the operating theatres as well as the wards, and also the support services such as the laboratory, pharmacy and imaging departments.










Sadly there are still many road accidents in Uganda. Here a coach has overturned on the side of a main road.

Our own hospital vehicles travel many miles both in our local region for outreach clinics etc. but also the 7 hour+trip to Kampala is quite often needed. We therefore rely on our mechanic Fred Ssembuya and the other drivers to maintain our vehicles safely.

We are still about 50 minutes drive from the nearest tarmac road and so the vehicles receive a lot of wear and tear on the murram (gravel) roads which can be very rough at times.

Collecting sick mothers or children who are urgent referrals to Kisiizi can be challenging especially driving at night when it can be pitch black as (thankfully) we have very little light pollution.




Sister Jane Kenyangi has recently returned to Kisiizi having successfully completed her degree qualifying her as a Tutor in our School of Nursing and Midwifery.

ANAESTHESIA EQUIPMENT UPGRADES







On the left and below is a new Universal Anaesthetics Machine recently received following kind support from Gradian health care through Joint Medical Stores, our main supplier. This is a really useful piece of equipment

helping us provide safe general anaesthesia and also with ventilatory support capability.

We have historically used halothane but will now have isoflurane as an alternative for certain cases where medically indicated.
